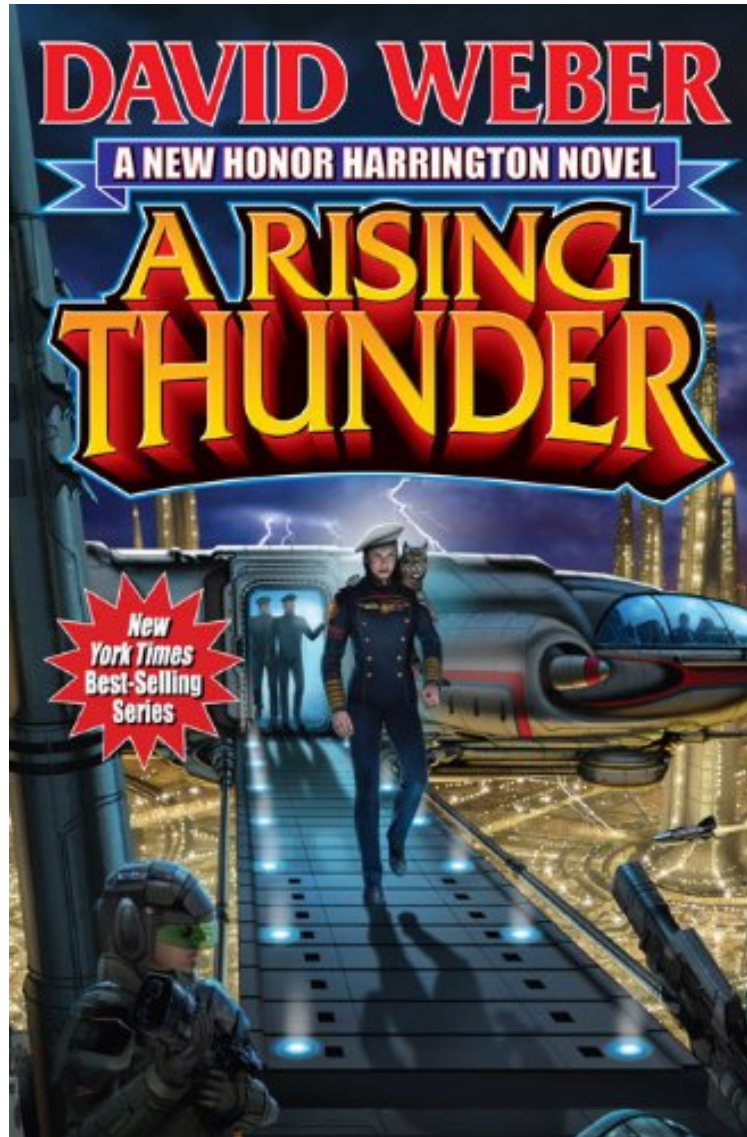

Die Handlung setzt einige Monate vor den letzten Kapiteln von "Mission of Honor" ein und schildert Zilwicki/Cachats Rueckkehr und die fortwaehrende Verschlechterung der Beziehungen zwischen Manticore und der solaren Liga. Ausgelost durch das Bekanntwerden der Ereignisse in "Torch of Freedom" bildet sich eine Anti-mesatische Allianz, bestehend aus Manticore, Grayson, Haven und Beowulf, waehrend die Buerokratie der Solaren Liga weiterhin unter vollstaendigen Realitaetsverlust leidet und das beste tut, den Zerfall der solaren Liga zu provozieren und Mesa in die Karten zu spielen. Die Angriff der solaren Liga auf Manticore, der in "Mission of Honor" angekuendigt wurde, geht erwartungsgemaess nicht gerade als durchschlagender Erfolg in die Geschichte des Honorverse ein, mehr will ich nicht verraten. Das Buch endet mal wieder mit einem Cliffhanger betreffend des naechsten auch eher idiotischen Plans der "Mandarine" der solaren Liga. Alles in allem ein relativ typischer Weber, mit einigen soliden aktionszenen und relativ viel Politik und eher langweiligen Meetings. Hier werden wie gesagt, die Fronten fuer den naechsten grossen konflikt Manticore VS sollies/Mesa gezogen und die Wandlung Havens zu den "guten" endlich abgeschlossen. Als langjaehriger Leser der Honor-Harrington-Serie war ich von diesem Band schwer entuscht. Vor allem, da ich nach den letzten Bnden doch eine etwas intensivere Geschichte erwartet habe. Dort sind es die 5 Oberpriester, die die Kirche korrumpiert haben und die anderen unterdrcken, hier sind es die 5 Mandarins, und so weiter. Ich musste beim Lesen schon an die "Suchen Ersetzen" Funktion denken.
