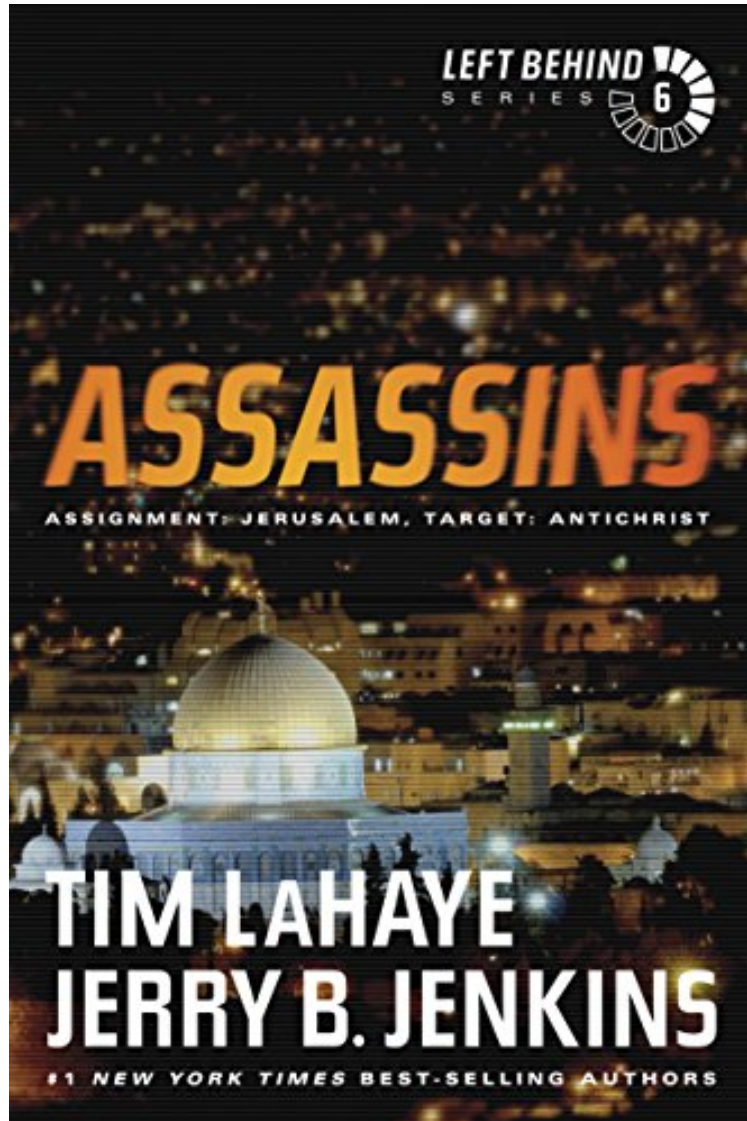

The authors needlessly point out that his excellency never uses contractions--let me point out that the authors don't use good characterization or dialogue. Let me restate from my earlier review of Left Behind that they can't write women well. It is so evident that the authors are now trying to make money versus make a difference, and that really saddens me.
