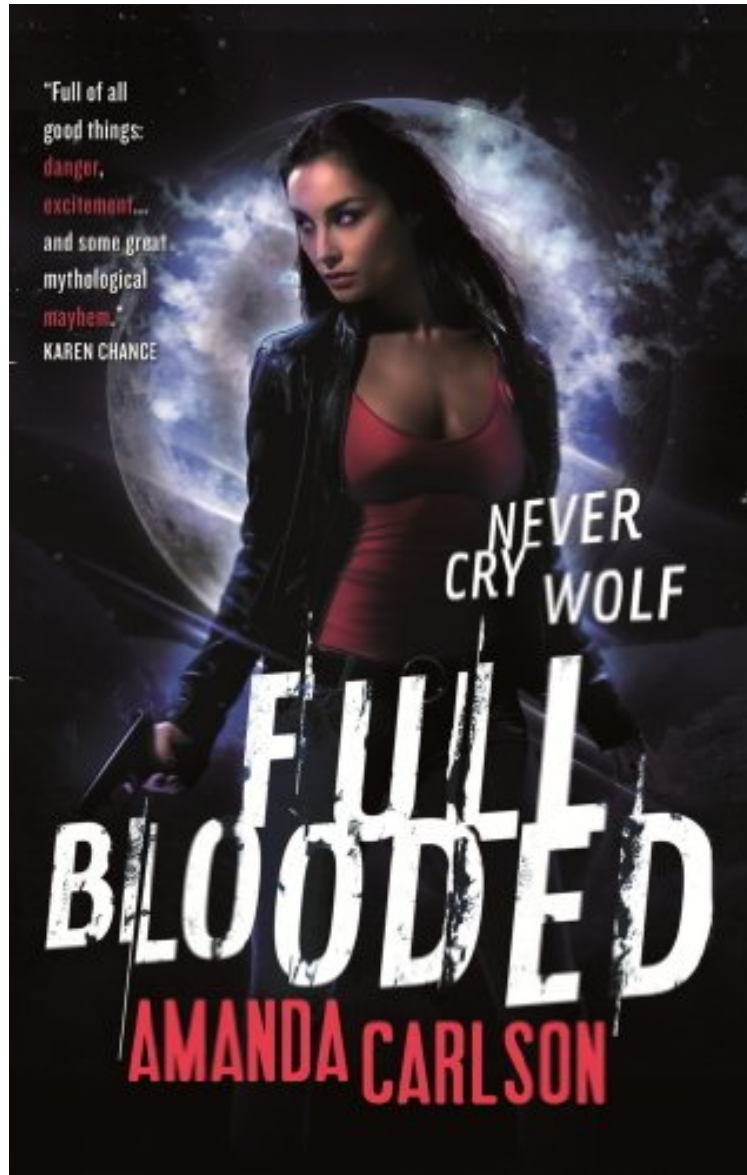

McClain isn't just different, she's feared. After living under the radar for the last twenty-six years, Jessica is thrust unexpectedly into her first change, a full ten years late. She wakes up and finds she's in the middle of a storm. Now that she's become the only female full-blooded werewolf in town, the supernatural world is already clamoring to take a bite out of her and her new Pack must rise up and protect her. But not everyone is on board. The werewolf Rights of Laws is missing text and the superstitious werewolves think that Jessica means an end to their race. It doesn't help when Jessica begins to realize she's more. [...] Review: The original Goodreads.com-text gives much more information - but I think it spoils a lot that you better find out piecemeal and along with Jessica, the 1st-person narrator [if you want more: there is always Goodreads]. The story starts with a bang, Jessica McClain is changing into a werewolf right away, something that should not be possible. Well her whole existence is deemed not possible by the Superhuman community, since the werewolves are always born male. But as it is, she was born the daughter of the Alpha of the U.S. Northern Territories Pack. Given that she never showed any inclinations to change into a full blooded wolf and stood outside the Pack Order, she left the Pack and built herself a life as a P.I. using an alias and unknown by the Superhuman Community. All that falls apart pretty fast with that unexpected change and pretty much the whole book is about Jessica coming to grips with the new developments, while at the same time staying her own person. What adds to her complicated situation, are a cop stalking her [he is sure she hides something that will get her into jail if he only uncovers it] and a myth about a female werewolf that will bring doom down on the whole race. As it is, the Pack is not overly happy to finally get that female wolf. What is more is that Jessica, being one-of-a-kind, finds out that she has abilities that are a tad unusual, even for a werewolf. This being the gist of it, the story is cool, but not what makes the book such a gripping read. It's Jessica and the revelations that are kind of brought upon her, it's the constant, palpable danger she is in that Amanda Carlson made me feel during the whole read. And besides, it's hilarious when she communicates with the she-wolf existing inside her now. It reminded me a bit of Jane Yellowrock, but where her Beast is a talking creature, Jessica's she-wolf is a real animal and behaves accordingly. That makes for pretty amusing scenes. The cast of characters is great: a totally relatable and likable heroine who comes into her power as she tries to live with everything thrown her way and although she didn't have much contact with her twin-brother, her father or other people of the pack, she is a family person and by no means a loner. I especially liked her father, who is on the one hand the most powerful Alpha on the planet and on the other hand a helpless father who just fears for his daughter. Him having more human traits than for example Mercy Thompson's father figure Bran, made him so much more relatable. Besides the characters, it's the pretty cool world building, with weres, vampires, demons and even an evil goddess that I liked and the hints that there is much more about Jessica McClain that meets the eye: there is an overall arc built that makes me happily continue to read the next installment of the series "Hot Blooded". Oh and it's a good thing, the next two books are already out, because "Full blooded" ends with a cliffhanger. Not the totally annoying kind, more like "Let's pack our bags, there is a journey to make, a rescue-mission to conduct and a lot of information to gather". It's just that the ends are not really wrapped up and I'm happy to read on now. If you like Mercy Thompson, Jane Yellowrock and/or Kate Daniels, you will like Jessica just as much.
