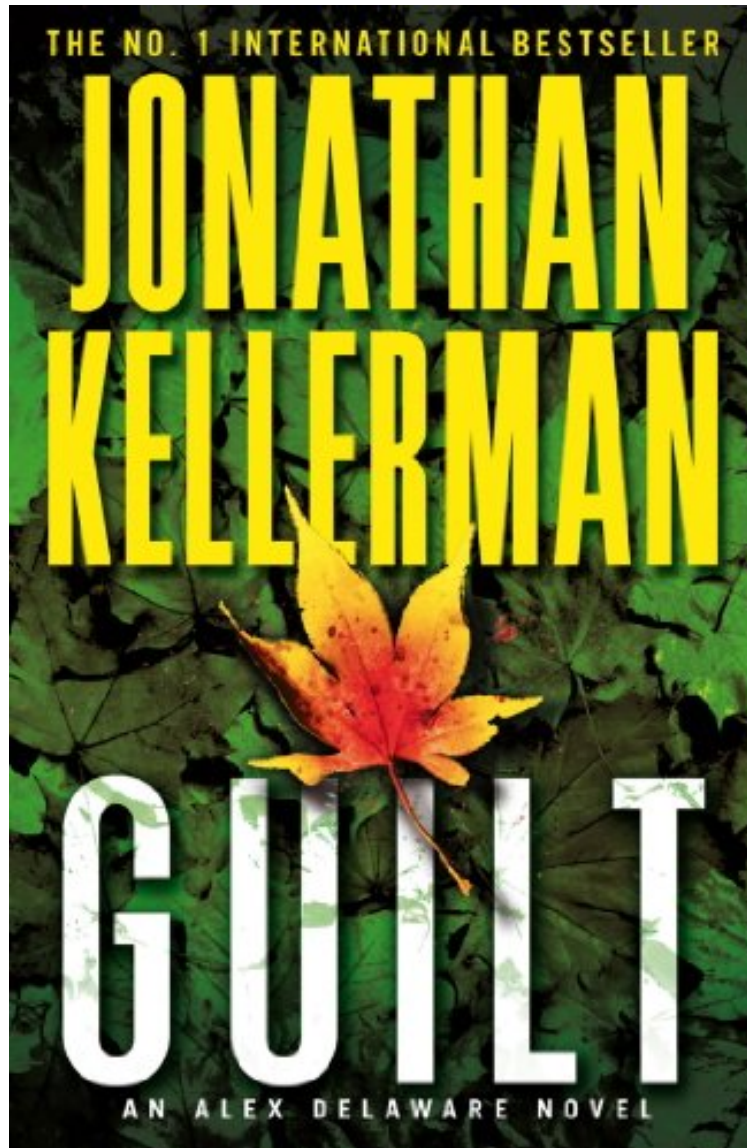

Guilt starts with finding a baby's remains, an event that ties into a string of events that only a highly imaginative writer might have connected in a reasonably effective way. I found the plot in Guilt to be one of the more surprising and interesting ones (up until quite near the end) that I have read in some time. It was a real roller coaster ride for me. The detection shifts in Guilt to Alex Delaware taking on the unaccustomed role of playing detective in the ways that the police normally do, but with a psychologist's flair. I found the change to be interesting and more than mildly amusing. It was a much better side of Alex Delaware than having him drive around with Milo Sturgis and report on his eating, a common role until the last two books in the series. I felt that the ultimate crime and story stretched a bit too far to be credible. Consequently, at the end I felt as if I were reading the answer to a brain-teaser rather than feeling fully pulled into the story. But it's definitely a stylish, if gross, brain-teaser.
