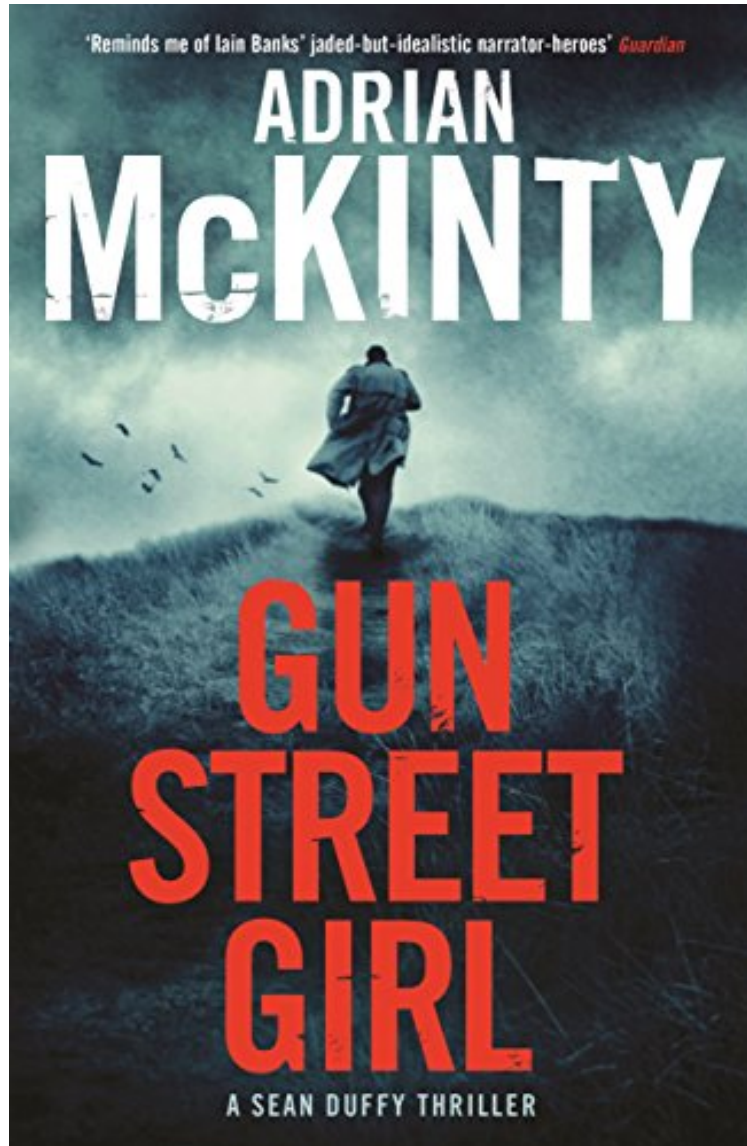

Weil der junge Verdchtige als Nachwuchswaffenhdler in den Diebstahl eines Raketensystems verwickelt war, sind Duffy und seine Kollegen nun nicht mehr nur auf der Suche nach einem Mrder, sondern gleich in eine Verschwörung verwickelt. Dabei wren die tglichen Unruhen und die Gewalt in den Straen des zerrteten Landes genug fr die Polizei Nordirlands, die Royal Ulster Constabulary. Duffys Suche nach der Wahrheit fhrt ihn nach Oxford, London und Schottland. Aber wo auch immer er hingehet nimmt er den Brgerkrieg in Nordirland mit sich. Die euphemistisch nur The Troubles bezeichneten Unruhen, Morde, Anschlge und Feindschaften zermrben seit Jahren die Heimat des Katholiken Duffys (einen sehr guten historischen Abriss zum Nordirland-Konflikt bietet die Bundeszentrale fr politische Bildung auf ihrer Homepage). Im Jahr des Anglo-irischen Abkommens verwebt Autor McKinty wieder konsequent das nordirische Desaster mit der Selbstvernichtung seines Protagonisten: zu Alkohol, Schlgen, Schusswunden und Drogen aller Art kommen diesmal auch profunde Herzschmerzen hinzu. Duffy verliebt sich gleich wieder in mehrere Frauen, von denen nur eine ihm wirklich gut zu tun scheint. Diese alte Bekannte, das Gun Street Girl, bietet ihm einen Ausweg aus der brutalen Tristesse seines Polizeireviere wird Duffy sich selbst erlsen knnen? McKinty steht an der Spitze. Having read volume 1 to 3, I really wanted to read more about his sympathetic, sometimes troubled and depressed but ever so often cool and smart hero. From book to book Duffy became more and more sort of a friend. The fourth volume kept all the promises of its predecessors. McKinty immediately takes you into his hero's head and thoughts, there is again his very special type of slang, his many references to temporary music, the poetic intermezzos, which lift McKinty's books beyond simple crime stories. Where I thought it was impossible to get better than the end of volume 3, McKinty somehow managed to take the story of Duffy to new heights. The story of a double-murder is again set against the background of the troubles, without ever falling into the usual cliches. Soon there are more deaths and conspiracies start blossoming all around. Duffy is as usual not impressed by important people, MI5 and Americans being involved and steps on many toes. So again five stars for Duffy! Highly recommended!
