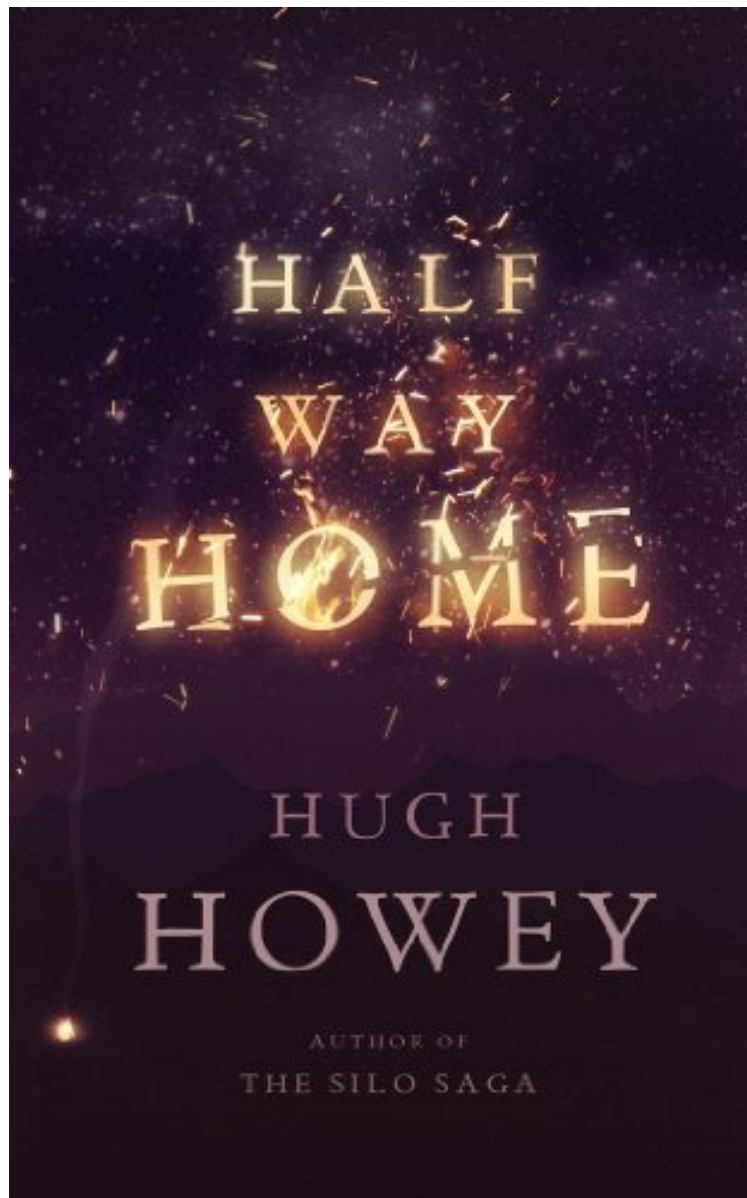

Wie in "Wool" geht es auch in "Half Way Home" nicht in erster Linie um einen Ausblick in die Welt der Zukunft, sondern eher um die Frage, wie sich eine Gruppe von Menschen miteinander und mit der Situation, in der sie sich befinden, auseinandersetzt. Das ist ebenso spannend, aber vom Ambiente her deutlich anders gelst als in Wool. Die Fragen, die Howey rund um die Idee der Kolonisation fremder Welten stellt, sind nur allzu realistisch und vermutlich auch in 200 Jahren noch wahr. No comparison to woolVon SHWhile I consider myself a fan of the wool saga, I was left very disappointed by this book from Hugh Howey.First of all the basic idea of the book are a bit familiar to anybody who has read Dune by Frank Herbert (giant caterpillars instead of sand worms, etc.) and seen Avatar (giant trees). Throw in a bit of 2001 (AI gone mad) and there you are...But this is by far not the only problem: The writing style is very simplistic, as is the overall story, it seems to be tailored to "young readers". Furthermore, while the world of wool had its own logic which was in itself meaningful, this is not the case here. There are a number of logic flaws in the story, the whole foundation seems very weak.Overall, to be fair, the first 100 pages or so seemed very promising (4 stars) but the rest is just too "flat" (1-2 stars).
