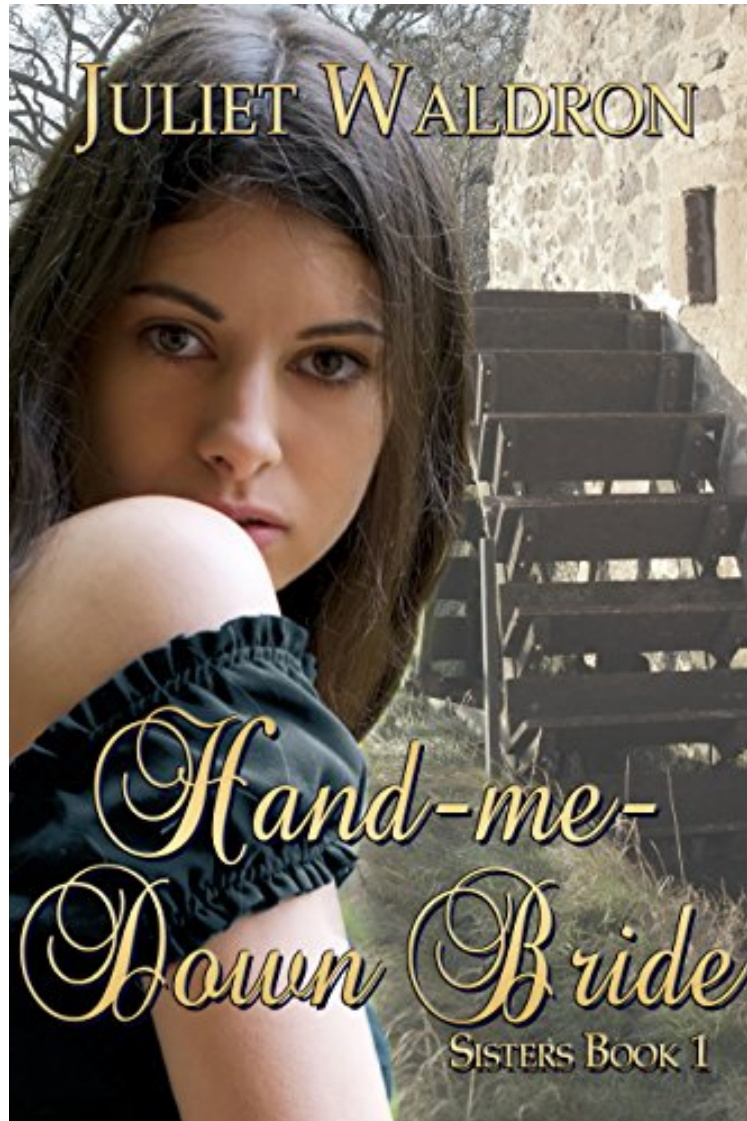

Sophie travels all the way from Germany to marry a much older man for whom the old traditions and customs are of great importance. She hopes to settle in well and be able to bring her mother and sisters to join her.The opening scene has Sophie waking up on the

day after her wedding to find that her new husband is dead. Her position is precarious as he had not yet made his financial provisions for such an event official and some are only too happy to get rid of her. Her son by marriage, the handsome Karl, is nearer to her own age and provides a lifeline. It is their relationship that becomes the romance. He is determined to get away from the old ways and be a real American. He is also haunted by his experiences in the Civil War. Sophie is often alienated by the manners and attitudes in the New World, but determined to work hard and fit in. I liked the characters and I loved the story side of the romance. The one thing that really irritated me and resulted in my 3 rating was the language. There are plenty of German phrases and sentences throughout the book, presumably to add authenticity. Sadly the German is very poor. If you don't speak German this won't bother you. If you do, it might just grate on your nerves. Had the German text been proofread and corrected, I would have given the book a 4.
