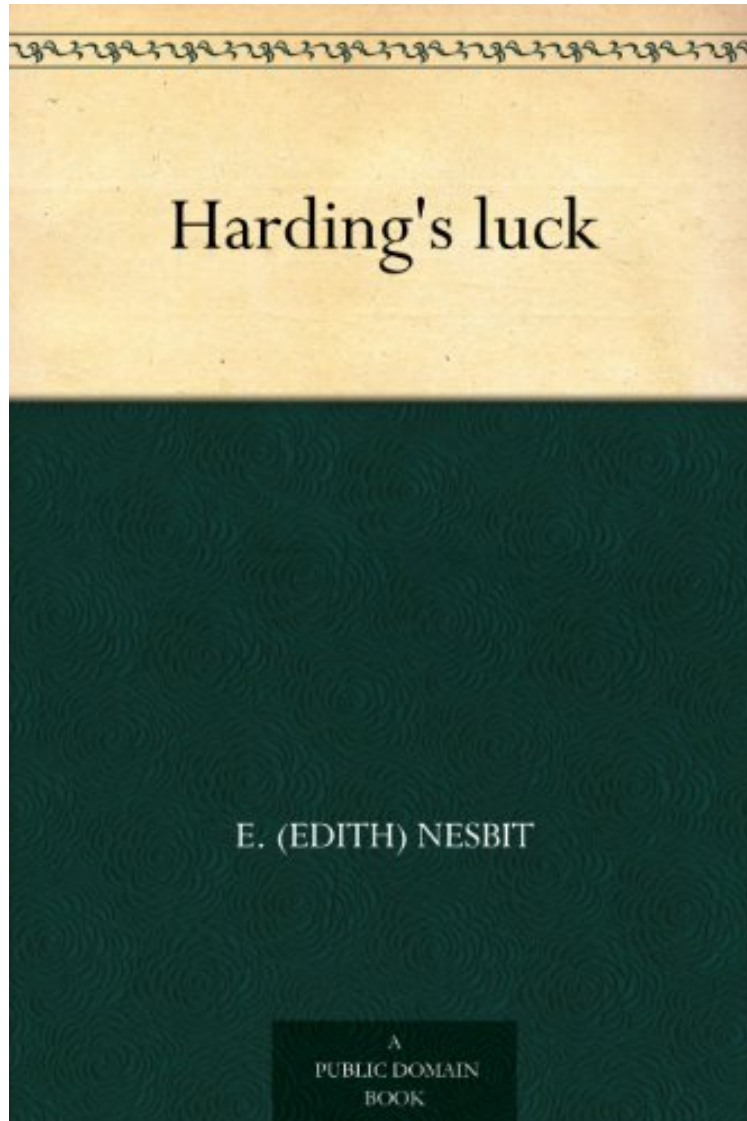

Nesbit. She wrote or collaborated on over 60 books of fiction for children, several of which have been adapted for film and television. She started a new genre of magical adventures arising from everyday settings and has been much imitated. She was also a political activist and co-founded the Fabian Society, a precursor to the modern Labour Party. Nesbit's books for children are known for being entertaining without turning didactic, although some of her earlier works, notably *Five Children and It* (1902) and even more so *The Story of the Amulet* (1906), veer in that direction. Among Nesbit's best-known books are *The Story of the Treasure Seekers* (1898), *The Wouldbegoods* (1899) and *The Railway Children* (1906). Other works include *The Phoenix and the Carpet* (1904), *The Enchanted Castle* (1907) and *The Magic City* (1910).
