favourite books - mostly for its wonderfully witty and hilarious main characters. The narrator, Layney, is a quick-witted, smart teenage girl, pretty grounded and yet sometimes her one worst enemy. The lead male equals her in many ways; and I just loved the banter between the two of them. They share a history - one of middle school first love and then mutual hate - and they also share a passion: their high school newspaper which they both fight to keep alive. This is also what keeps them connected, being forced to co-lead the group. Of course, there is a big, bad secret why their love turned into hate, and it is not such a big surprise. I have to admit, I would have liked the end to be a little more fleshed out, but still, I love the way leading up to it - their dialogues, the hilarious situations they are getting into, and the fact that you can read between the lines how much he still cares for her. (I very much prefer that you read this between the lines and not in some weird romantic assumptions she makes - quite the contrary, she never cuts him much slack and this is what keeps the story interesting and believable.) Summing up - this is in many ways your usual YA fiction, but the difference is in the main characters. You don't have your troubled female with romantic assumptions here, and neither the dark, brooding young male who is mysteriously attractive yet unattainable - but instead a funny, very likeable pair that was slapped badly by fate in the past and is now starting to deal with it. Very much recommended!
