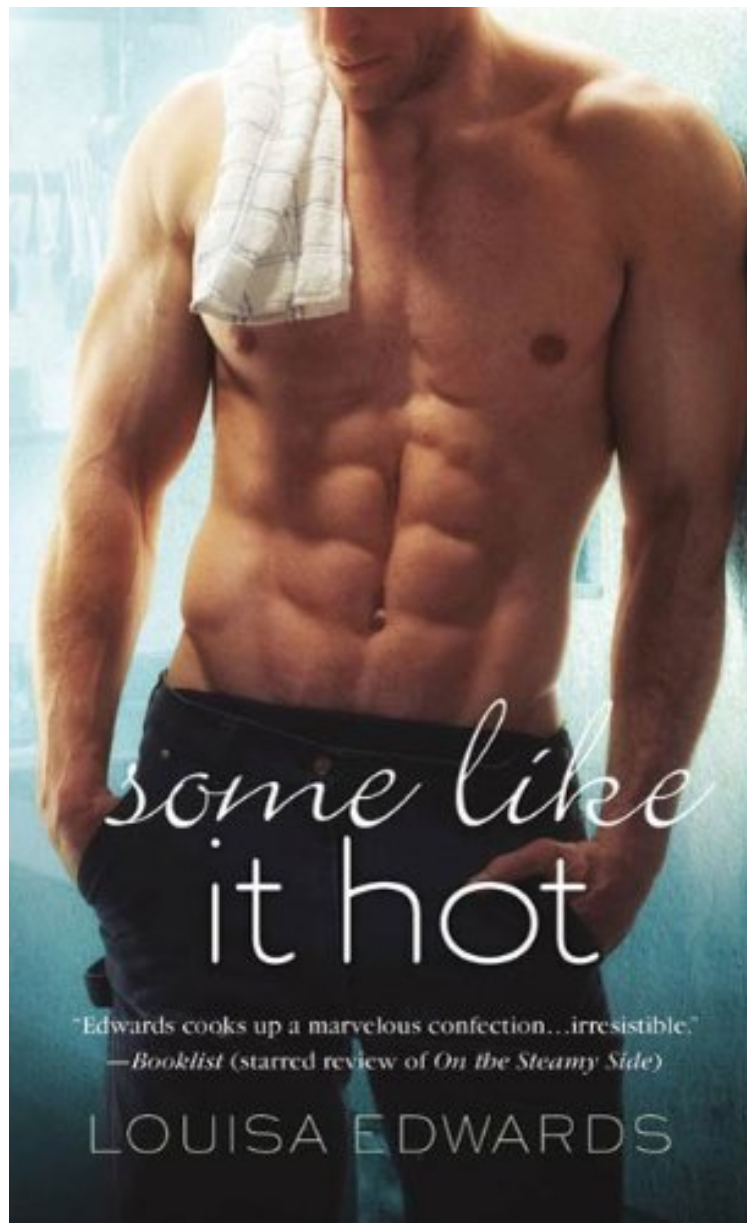

die Geschichte an sich gut gefallen, ich fand es spannend erneut eine so tolle Zeit in der Küche verbringen zu können und die Charaktere bei ihrer Liebe zur jeweiligen Arbeit beobachten zu dürfen. Leider blieben für mich die großen Emotionen aus und die Protagonisten schafften es kaum von ihren Gefühlen füreinander zu berzeugen. Es gab zwar zur Genge sexuelle Anziehungskraft und Funken, die für prickelnde Szenen sorgten, aber für eine glaubhafte Beziehung blieben mir die Gefühle zu oberflächlich. Natürlich sollte man die Vorgeschichte von Danny und Eva in *Too Hot To Touch* nicht vergessen, aber dennoch kann diese die emotionale Bindung nicht zur Gänze übernehmen. Das Kochen steht erneut im Mittelpunkt der Geschichte und der Wettkampf um den Titel des Rising Star Chef spitzt sich immer weiter zu. Man muss dieses Ambiente aber mögen, ansonsten kann schnell Langeweile aufkommen, wenn man mit den Erklärungen im Küchenbereich oder Rezepten nichts anfangen kann. Ich mag diesen Aspekt jedoch gerne und habe nach dem Lesen immer direkt Lust mich selbst in die Küche zu stellen und was auszuprobieren. Die Charaktere verbringen leider nicht so viel Zeit miteinander, wie es bei Max und Jules der Fall war. Da sie aber nicht beide in der Küche tätig sind sehen sie sich zum überwiegenden Teil außerhalb der Küche. Und diese Momente sind eher die Seltenheit, weil andere Faktoren ebenso eine Rolle spielen und den beiden einiges an Zeit stehlen. Da bleibt es leider nicht aus sich zu fragen, warum die beiden Gefühle füreinander entwickeln, wenn sie doch kaum die Möglichkeit hatten Zeit mit einander zu verbringen. Es ist fast so als würde man als Leser ein wenig außen vor stehen und das Endergebnis präsentiert bekommen, aber nicht weiß wie man dorthin gelangt ist, weil man vom Wettkampf so fasziniert und auch abgelenkt war. Dazu kommt, dass man das Gefühl bekommt, die Charaktere stehen sich ihrem Glück selbst im Weg. Es war teilweise schon frustrierend zu beobachten, wie sie das Wichtige nicht sehen konnten, aber andererseits Kleinigkeiten mehr Beachtung schenkten, als diesen Zustand. Die Nebencharaktere kennen wir ja bereits aus dem 1. Band und lernen sie hier noch besser kennen. Sie machen Fehler wie jeder normale Mensch, lernen aber daraus was sie nur vielschichtiger erscheinen lässt. Beigens ist die Geschichte rund um Kane und Claire immer noch nicht abgeschlossen und wird uns weiterhin begleiten. Zum Glück war mir Claire hier sympathischer als im Vorgängerband und endlich lernt man sie besser kennen. Ansonsten wäre die Nebenhandlung nämlich sehr langweilig für mich geworden bzw. wäre ich versucht gewesen sie nur noch zu überblättern. Das Geschehen zum Ende hin war mir dann aber fast einen Tick zu dramatisch. Die Charaktere berschlagen sich fast und so viel wie hier über Gefühle gesprochen wird kam im ganzen Buch nicht vor. An sich ist das nichts Schlechtes, ich fand es nur ein wenig ungünstig verteilt. Auf die ganze Geschichte aufgeteilt wäre es nämlich realistischer gewesen, als die plötzlichen Einsichten der Protagonisten zum Schluss hin. Die Charaktere bleiben sich dabei trotzdem sich selbst gegenüber treu und das rechne ich der Autorin hoch an, dass sie ihnen zum Schluss hin nicht neue Charaktereigenschaften zuschreibt, die nicht zu ihnen passen würden. So ist die Entwicklung durchaus nachvollziehbar, wenn auch für mein Gefühl etwas zu schnell abgehandelt. Auf die Fortsetzung freue ich mich trotzdem schon sehr und bin nach der explosiven Stimmung, die man hier erleben durfte, besonders neugierig auf Beck. Er war bis jetzt immer sehr verschlossen und in sich gekehrt, das ändert sich hoffentlich mit Band 3 und zeigt ihn etwas offener. Vor allem werden nun all die Gerichte geklärt, die es um Beck gibt und wir lernen ihn besser kennen. 'Gegenste ziehen sich an' scheint das Thema von *Hot Under Pressure* zu werden. Auch an ein paar anderen Stellen ist die Geschichte noch nicht abgeschlossen und man darf gespannt sein, wie Louisa Edwards dies alles zu einem schönen Abschluss bringen möchte und wird.
