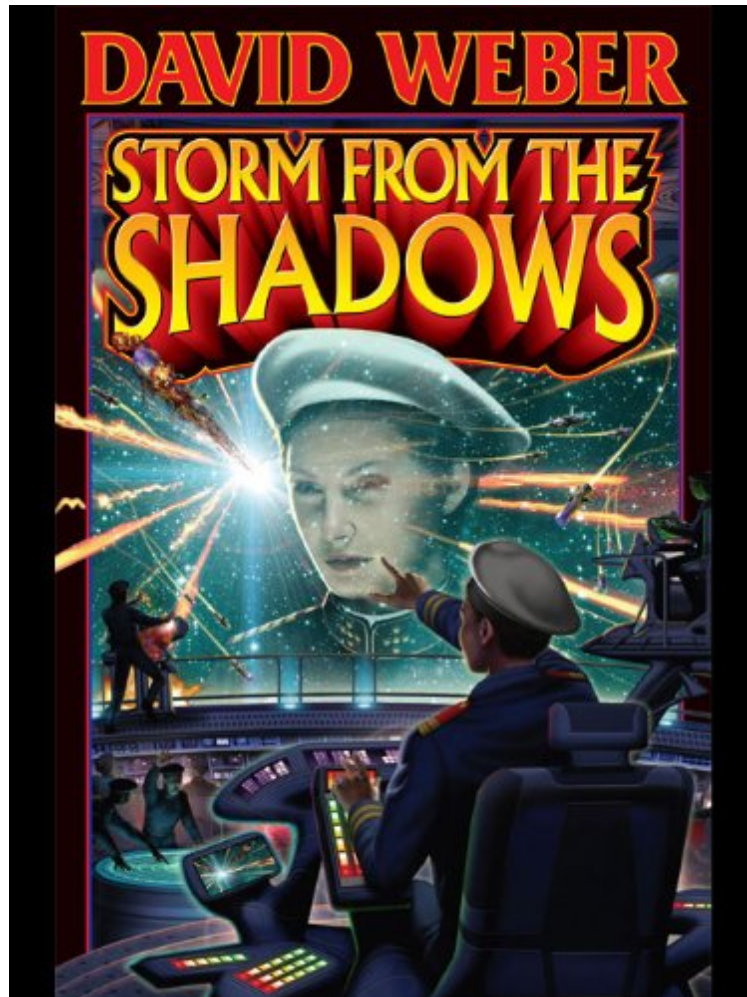

Es ist ein sehr, sehr gutes Buch. Trotzdem gebe ich nur vier Sterne - warum? weil die Wiederholungen bereits aus anderer Sicht bekannter Szenen doch recht umfangreich sind.Zur Handlung nur so viel: Es geht - nach dem Ende der Wiederholungen - wieder um den Talbott-Cluster. Nach der Dresche, die Mesa und das OFS beim letzten Versuch, Manticore dort an den Karren zu

fahren, bezogen haben, sinnen beide auf Revanche. Doch während das OFS das eher Ingerfristig plant, möchte Mesa (welches endlich auch umfassender geschildert wird) möglichst schnell sein Konto ausgleichen. Ein willfähriger solarischer Admiral samt Kampfverband, welche Mesa als Marionette einsetzen kann, ist auch bald gefunden - ebenso wie eine neue Krisensituation (die Mesa natürlich selbst erst aufbaut ...) Es gibt natürlich auch ein Wiedersehen mit einigen liebgewordenen Charakteren aus Shadow of Saganami; ein paar echte Überraschungen in der Handlung sind - Webertypisch - ebenfalls mit dabei; und das Buch endet, wie schon gesagt, mit einem Cliffhanger, der wohl erst mit dem nächsten Honorverse-Roman "Mission of Honor" (MoH) aufgelöst werden wird ... Denn zwischen Storm from the Shadows und MoH kommt ja noch die Fortsetzung von Crown of Slaves, die er zusammen mit Eric Flint schreibt. Für Fans der Serie ist das Buch ein definitives Mu; für Neueinsteiger jedoch nur bedingt geeignet. Denn trotz der umfangreichen Wiederholungen wird doch bereits recht viel an Serienwissen vorausgesetzt. Storm from the Shadows ist der Nachfolger zu The Shadow of Saganami und fügt sich nahtlos in den Handlungsstrang ein. Alte Bekannte wie Michelle "Mike" Henke werden der Handlung noch mit hinzugefügt, was nur logisch ist da Mike durch ihre Freilassung aus der Kriegsgefangenschaft nicht wieder gegen Haven antreten darf. Der Handlung schadet das natürlich nicht und man darf sich auf einige tolle Kapitel mit ihr freuen. Storm from the Shadows setzt genau dort an wo Mike zurückgelassen wird und man erlebt die ersten Seiten durch ihre Perspektive wobei einige Teile der Handlung schon aus At All Costs bekannt sind.
