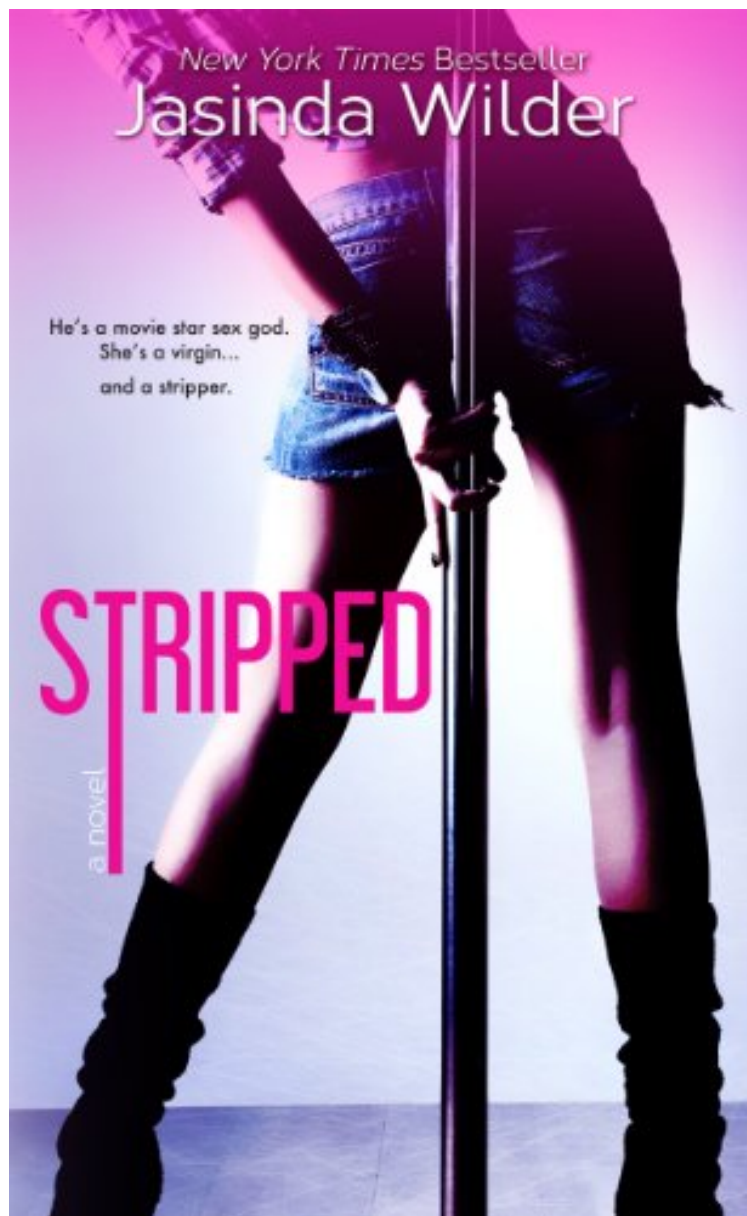

get on this blog tour, I was really excited. And damn, she has done it again. She made me smile, she made me cry and bawl like a baby, she made me angry and yell at my Kindle, she made me bite my nails, she made my heart melt and she made me feel the need for a cold shower all this just through her writing. So I would say this book is another success for Jasinda. The book starts with the happenings of a couple years before the main events, giving us a glimpse of Grey Amundsens life before becoming a stripper. Growing up a pastors daughter, she has been taught to follow rules, behave and fulfil her fathers expectations despite the fact that the things she should do and the things she wants to do differ. After a tragic loss she decides to follow her heart. But in order to do this, she needs money and thats how she ends up in a sleazy strip club. Troubled, confused, self-loathing, full of guilt and shame and without knowing herself or having an identity she meets Dawson Kellar, the Hollywood star, the playboy, the male God incarnate. The chemistry between them is there from the start a connection and a bond neither can explain. As they end up spending more time together, feelings develop and go deeper. But this isnt without problems. Grey is insecure of what she wants and what she shouldnt want. Due to her upbringing, she is in a constant state of disconnect between what her heart wants and what her conscience tells her. Her character was a wonderfully painful examples of what happens when religion and beliefs are used in misguided measures, when a parents love and care harms more than does any good. Greys state of confusion and lack of self-love was the direct consequence of an upbringing that -through use of religion- tried to control, instil fear, shame and guilt in order to ensure a certain behaviour and in order to protect. Although it might have been done with good intentions, it caused Grey to lose herself, her identity. And it makes it hard for her to allow her feelings for Dawson to show, to accept them. Jasinda took us through the process of Grey coming into herself, learning to love who she is, forgiving herself for mistakes she has made, learning to be proud of herself, accepting love from others and finally making her own rules. It takes her a long time to do the things that make her happy, without guilt, shame or labelling herself a sinner. The depth in which her character as well as her struggles were portrayed was breath-taking and dumb-founding. Although at times I had the urge to slap some sense into the girl, I could feel her pain, her confusion and understood her feeling of being lost. Dawson on the other hand is not only incredibly sexy but just downright adorable. Stinking rich and famous, he could have anyone on this planet probably even all of them at once. Yet, he sets his eye on Grey and from that point doesnt give up. Not expecting anything in return from her, he wants to make sure she is safe and happy not minding any expense or possible risk to his career. The things he does for her made me gasp the things he does to and with her nearly made me pant. Holy mother of all that is hot and sizzling there is no doubt Jasinda Wilder is the master of hot, realistic sex scenes that knock your socks off. Having his own issues to work through, he is endlessly patient and understanding towards Grey, showing love and compassion and sometimes ignoring her stubborn behaviour as he instinctively knows what she needs in that moment. He is fierce and at times possessive and an alpha-male with a good heart and sweet personality and did I mention that he is sexy. So sexy I suddenly want to buy a Bugatti (read the book and you will know why). Even before Grey knew she was in love with him, I was in love with him for her. Jasinda writes characters that arent good or bad. There isnt just black and white in her books. She actually delves into the palette of grays and paints the most wonderful pictures with all those shades. While in Wounded it was a prostitute, here it is a stripper.
