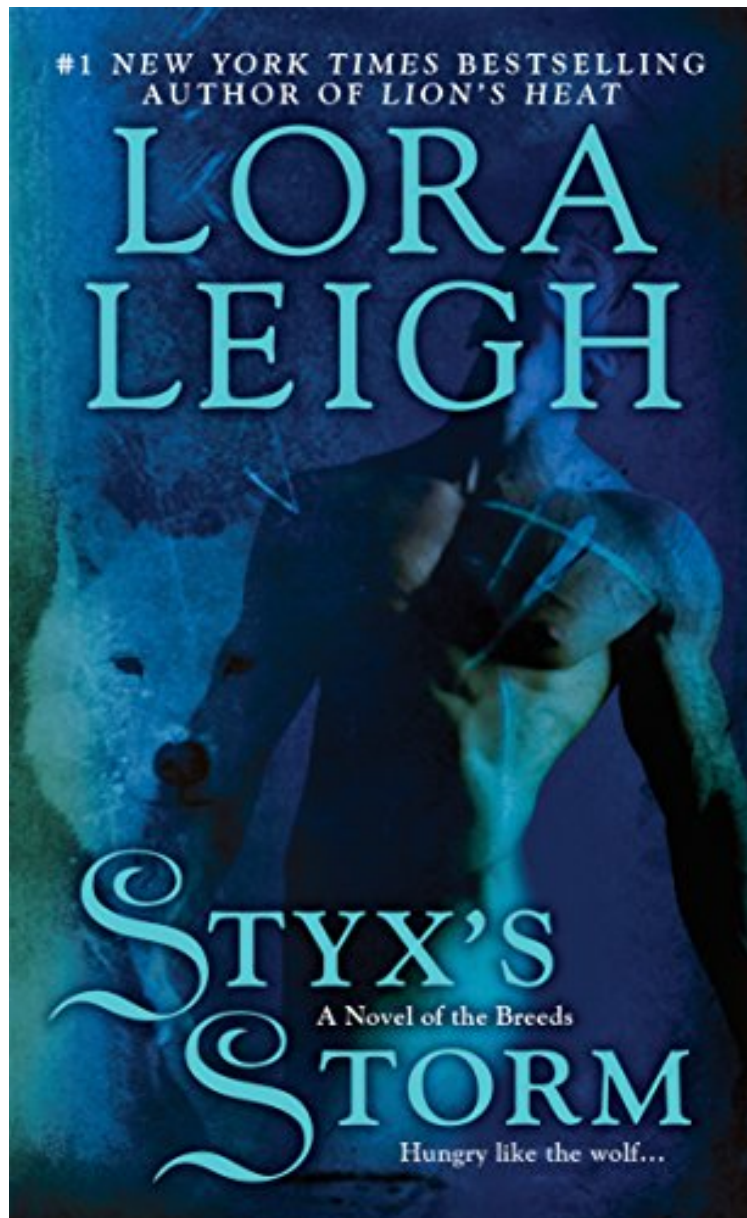


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Styx's Storm (Breed)

etwas verwirrt. Eigentlich ist man von Lora Leigh gewohnt, dass die Breed-Serie ihr absolutes Lieblings"kind" ist und auch dementsprechend gut geschrieben ist. Klar, lesen kann man fast alle Bücher der Autorin schnell und gut, aber diesmal waren mir die Charaktere einfach zu unglaubwürdig (okay, mal davon abgesehen, dass es paranormal/fiction ist, LOL, ich meine unglaubwürdig für alle, die mit der Serie/dem Genre vertraut sind), und sogar als Hauptpersonen einfach nur unsympathisch. Ja, man fühlt mit Storme mit, sie hat eine traumatische Vergangenheit und wird ziemlich unfair von Styx herein gelegt, aber dann erfährt man, wie kindisch sie sich seit über 10 Jahren benimmt, und das ändert sich auch nicht wirklich bis zum Schluss, also bitte, einerseits glaubt sie an Jonas' Vertrauenswürdigkeit, aber gleichzeitig will sie ihm die Daten nicht geben - warum? Nur wegen dessen, was ihr Vater gesagt hat? Also bitte! Dann ist da Styx, man erfährt einfach kaum etwas wirklich über ihn, außer dass er wie ein Highlander aussieht und Schokolade liebt. Hm. Der Rest des Buches handelt davon, wie alle versuchen, Storme dazu zu bringen, die Daten den Breed zu geben, und außerdem ihre Meinung/Angst zu beeinflussen. Mich stört an Lora Leigh als Autorin einfach ihre offensichtliche Unfähigkeit, in vielen Büchern, u.a. diesem, Probleme per Kommunikation zu lösen statt mit (viel) Sexszenen, die weiblichen Charaktere werden sich (ihren Prinzipien) immer selbst untreu, sobald der männliche Held sie auch nur ansieht... das ist ein Schema, das sich durch alle Stories zieht, und wenn man davon absieht, dass es paranormal erotic/romance ist, können andere Autoren das ja auch. The weakest link Von Skywalker in Styx storm is certainly not one of the better books of this series. There are quite a few stories we are waiting for but it has to be a breed who was mentioned only once in the last book. I never really managed to like Storme because she feels sorry for herself all the time and cannot see that the breeds are actually protecting her. You can't really say anything about Styx because he remains a very shallow character. I can't see anything special in him. The same goes for the story of the book. Nothing really happens! In the end you have to ask yourself why Lora Leigh wrote it. Everyone is after Storme because she has data which could help Jonas. His little daughter was infected with something and he is sure that the data could help to find a cure. The council is after the data because they - like always - want to harm the breeds. In the beginning Styx caught her and the whole story is set in Haven. It's all about: "Give me the microchip." "I don't have it" or "We breeds are not as bad as you think." "You killed my father and my brother and I hate all of you." Besides that nothing happens. I don't know which person the next book will be about but I really hope that it will bring us forward in the overall story.
